Dear Assembly Member Medina:

On behalf of the Association of California Community College Administrators (ACCCA), I am writing in support of Assembly Bill (AB) 30. The College and Career Access Pathways (CCAP) is a partnership between a community college district and a school district that offers college courses to high school students so that they can get a jump start on their college education. This bill would, among other things, allow for units completed by a student pursuant to a CCAP agreement to count towards determining their registration priority for enrollment and course registration at a community college.

The CCAP has been a successful joint initiative of the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office and the California Department of Education that allows high school students to dual enroll in up to 15 community college units per term. The initiative has helped to develop seamless pathways from high school to community college for career technical education (CTE) or general education transfer.

ACCCA supports AB 30 because it will make the CCAP initiative more efficient and will benefit the students that are in those programs. For these reasons, we strongly support AB 30 and will urge the members of the Assembly Higher Education Committee to vote "aye" for this measure.
