## San Bernardino Valley College

Diana Z. Rodriguez is the President of the San Bernardino Valley College. Since assuming leadership of the college in 2016, she has established a track record of increasing student enrollment, advocating for institutional innovation and professional development, and successfully mobilizing campus-wide support for student success-related initiatives. In 2017, San Bernardino Valley College graduated the largest class in its 90-year history, thanks in part to initiatives promoted by Rodriguez.

In 2018, Dr. Rodriguez was named *Woman of the Year* by California's 47th Assembly District—an award that recognizes women for accomplishments in their respective fields and for their dedication to improving the lives of others. The award is one of several recognitions Rodriguez received since becoming the first Latina president of San Bernardino Valley College. In 2017, she received the Legacy of Service Award from the Librería Del Pueblo, a local community services agency.

She earned a BA, MA and MBA from California State University, San Bernardino and is currently a doctoral candidate at Northcentral University in Scottsdale, AZ. Dr. Rodriguez is a native of Southern California, a second-generation Mexican-American and a first-generation community college student, which mirrors the social and cultural background of a vast majority of the community college students in the region.



Dr. Jose Fierro, President/Superintendent
Cerritos CCD

Dr. Jose Fierro began his tenure as President/Superintendent of the Cerritos Community College District in July 2015. He is committed to increasing access to education, thereby lifting the community's underserved population from personal hardship to success. Dr. Fierro launched Cerritos Complete in 2016, which increases graduation rates and velocity of completion through wraparound student services and a merit-based scholarship component. Cerritos Complete won the 2018 Examples of *Excelencia* Award in the Associate Level category, which is the only national effort to identify and promote evidence-based practices that help accelerate Latino student success in higher education. The program was also selected as a finalist for the 2018 Bellwether Award.

Dr. Fierro serves on various boards at the local, state, and national levels, including the Chief Executive Officers of the California Community Colleges (CEOCCC) Board, Community College League Board of Directors, National Community College Hispanic Council Board of Directors, Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education Alliance Executive Committee, Los Angeles/Orange County Regional Consortium Governance Council, and Coast Plaza Hospital Board of Directors in Norwalk.

Dr. Fierro earned his D.V.M. from the University of Applied Sciences in Bogotá, Colombia and his Ph.D. in Higher Education Leadership from Northcentral University in Prescott, Arizona. He also holds an M.S. in Leadership and Management of Educational Programs from Nova Southeastern University.



Dr. Byron D. Clift Breland, Chancellor San Jose – Evergreen CCD

Dr. Byron D. Clift Breland serves as Chancellor of San Jose – Evergreen Community College District (SJECCD). Prior to being appointed Chancellor, he served as President of San Jose City College and held various positions at the University of Maryland at College Park and the University of Southern California.

As a leader working in the field of education, Dr. Clift Breland has always known the importance of being engaged in the broader community, having served on a number of boards to promote equity in housing and economic opportunities, as well as gains in educational outcomes for traditionally underrepresented groups. Dr. Breland holds a Bachelor of Science degree in consumer economics and a Master of Science degree in family studies from the University of Maryland, College Park. She has worked at Butte College for over thirty years, most recently serving as the Vice President for Student Learning and Economic Development.

Prior to moving into administration, Samia taught English as a Second Language and developmental reading and writing for fifteen years. Dr. Yaqub received her doctorate in education with an emphasis on Community College Leadership from Oregon State University. Her dissertation, *Latina Student Perceptions of Learning Communities*, won the RP Group Excellence in Dissertation award in 2011. She also holds a master's degree in English from CSU, Chico and a bachelor's degree in English from UC Davis.

Dr. Yaqub has served on the board of directors for the Inspire School of Arts and Sciences and serves as an advisory board member of the California Writing Project. She served on the ACCCA board of directors from 2008 - 2014 and co-chaired the ACCCA Mentor Program from 2011-2015. She is currently on the ACCCA Board representing CEOs. She also serves on the board of directors for the Boys and Girls Club of the North Valley and a board member of the Chico Chamber of Commerce. Her professional interests include leadership development, student equity, and faculty/staff diversity.



Dr. Frank Chong, Superintendent/President Santa Rosa Junior College/Sonoma CCD

Dr. Frank Chong is Superintendent/President of Santa Rosa Junior College (SRJC). Under his leadership, Measure H, the \$410 million bond to support SRJC technology and facilities, passed in 2014 and in 2015, SRJC also received full accreditation.

Prior to his CEO role at Santa Rosa, Dr. Chong served as the Deputy Assistant Secretary for Community Colleges at the U.S. Department of Education in Washington, D.C. under Secretary Arne Duncan. He has also served as President of Laney College (Oakland) and Mission College (Santa Clara), and as Special Assistant to Willie Brown, Speaker of the California Assembly.

Dr. Sunita "Sunny" Cooke began her tenure as the superintendent/president of MiraCosta Community College District in 2015. A recognized community college leader, Dr. Cooke came to MiraCosta from Grossmont College, located in east San Diego County, where she served as president for nearly eight years. She started as a faculty member and has been an educator for over 24 years after receiving her Ph.D. in Biology from Georgetown University.

Dr. Cooke has worked at local and state levels in economic and workforce development in Texas and California. In 2015, she chaired the Statewide Task Force on Workforce and a Strong Economy, ensuring that California state and the community college system remain vital leaders in this work. The work has resulted in an ongoing annual investment of approximately \$248 million to enhance CA community college career education.

Dr. Cooke is an active member of the greater San Diego community and national boards, including the San Diego Workforce Partnership, San Diego Economic Development Council, Biocom, and the Carlsbad Chamber of Commerce. Dr. Joi Lin Blake is the 10<sup>th</sup> Superintendent/President of the Palomar Community College District/Palomar College. Dr. Blake has a passion and focus on building programs and services that embody social justice, equity and inclusion. At Palomar College she has been instrumental in fostering strong campus and community relationships; securing grant funding and strengthening the Palomar Foundation; advancing the tenets of collective impact through a variety of key initiatives such as expansion of the Palomar Promise tuition-free program for high school students and funding to address food insecurities on college campuses. Under her leadership the college has opened the Education Centers in Rancho Bernardo and Fallbrook.

Her previous administrative and leadership positions include serving as president at College of Alameda in the Peralta Community College District; Vice President of Student Services at Skyline College; Dean of Student Development and Matriculation at San Diego Mesa College; and Academic Senate President at Southwestern College. She also formerly served as a tenured Professor/Counselor.

At the national level, Blake served as Policy Assistant for the U.S. Department of Education, in the Offices of the Under Secretary, and Vocational and Adult Education. She has served on the California Community Colleges statewide Chief Student Services Officers Board and she is currently on the State Advisory Committee on Legislation, the CEO Student-Centered Funding
