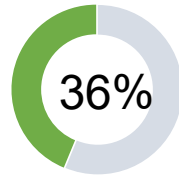

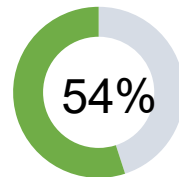

Full-time Enrollment

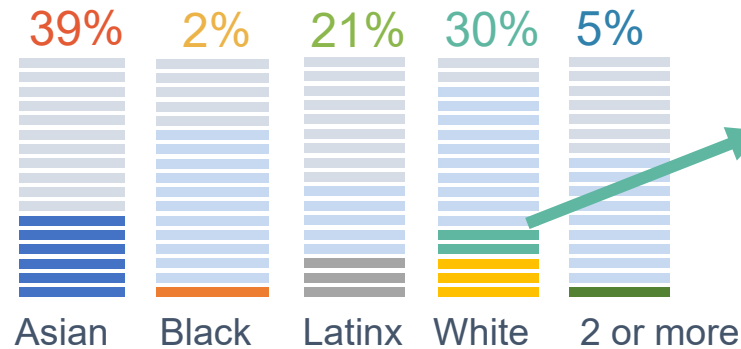

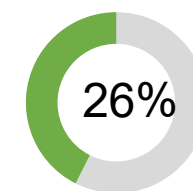

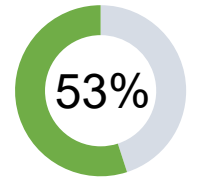

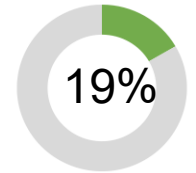

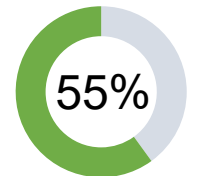

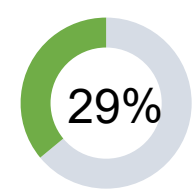
