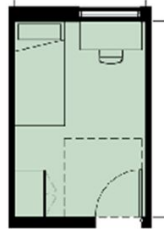
Conceptual Design: Bird's Eye View

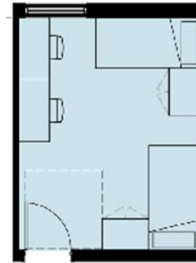

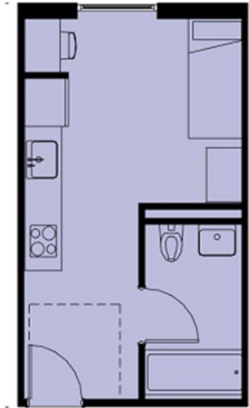
