[AB 1858 \(Lowenthal\)](#)

Title: California Community Colleges and California State University: Joint Associate Degree Pilot Program

Status: Assembly Higher Education Committee

Summary:

This bill would require, contingent upon an appropriation, the California Community Colleges and California State University (CSU) Chancellors to establish a pilot program offering a jointly conferred associate degree in general education studies for former CSU students who completed qualifying coursework but did not earn a degree. The bill would require participation by Long Beach City College and CSU Long Beach, authorize up to three additional partnerships, and require a report to the Legislature by January 1, 2032.

Title: Public Postsecondary Education: Priority Registration: Veterans and Dependents of Veterans: Federal Gi Bill

Summary:

This bill would require the California State University and each community college district, and would request the University of California, with respect to each campus in their respective jurisdictions that administers a priority enrollment system, commencing with the 2028-29 academic year, to grant priority for registration for enrollment to (1) a student who receives a fee waiver pursuant to the above-described provisions, and (2) a student who is using any federal GI Bill benefits.

Title: Postsecondary Education: Articulation Agreements

Status: Assembly Higher Education Committee

Summary:

This bill would streamline how community college courses transfer to California State University (CSU) and University of California (UC) campuses by creating a systemwide articulation agreement based on common course numbering templates, rather than requiring individual course-by-course review. The bill requires the Intersegmental Committee of the Academic Senates of UC, CSU, and the California Community Colleges to establish this agreement by July 1, 2027; if they fail to do so, the segments themselves must implement it by December 31, 2027. Beginning in the spring 2027-28 academic term, the streamlined agreement would become the standard method for transferring courses covered by the common course numbering system. The bill also requires annual public reporting on the agreement's results and requires campuses to post contact information for the person responsible for articulation at each campus.

Title: Teacher Credentialing: Programs of Professional Preparation: California State University and Community College Partnerships

Status: Assembly Education Committee

Summary:

This bill would, contingent upon an appropriation, require the Chancellor of the California Community Colleges and the California State University to develop and implement a plan to increase partnerships between California State University campuses and community colleges that addresses (1) the expansion of online programs of professional preparation to increase access and opportunities for students pursuing teaching careers in rural communities, and (2) allowing dual enrollment between community colleges and the California State University for students pursuing a teaching credential.

Title: Public Postsecondary Education: Intersegmental Partnerships: Stem Education

Status: Assembly Higher Education Committee

Summary:

This bill would establish the Cal-Bridge Program in state law as an intersegmental partnership among the California Community Colleges, California State University, and the University of California to create a pathway for students—particularly those from diverse backgrounds—majoring in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) to pursue PhD programs and careers in academia or the technology sector. The bill defines the program’s goals and structure, including multiple subprograms that provide mentorship, research opportunities, professional development, and financial support for undergraduate, doctoral, and postdoctoral STEM scholars. It also establishes the ENLACE Program, which would collaborate with Cal-Bridge to help prepare high school and college students for STEM education and careers through additional support and pathway programs.

Title: Public Postsecondary Education: Priority Registration: Members and Former Members of the Armed Forces of the United States and State Guard

Summary:

This bill would extend priority registration at public colleges and universities for members and former members of the U.S. Armed Forces and the State Guard by removing the current 15-year time limit for using this benefit. Under the bill, community college districts and the California State University must continue granting priority enrollment, and the University of California is requested to do so, without the 15-year restriction after leaving active duty.

Title: Community Colleges: External Resolution Services for Civil Rights Compliance: Managing Entity and Title IX Coordinator

Status: Assembly Higher Education Committee

Position:

Summary:

This bill would require the Board of Governors (BOG), by June 1, 2027, and every three years thereafter, to enter into a contract with a managing entity to administer on behalf of the California Community Colleges external resolution services for civil rights compliance, including developing and recommending a nondiscrimination policy, assisting the California Community College Chancellor's Office in developing a campus discrimination prevention training program for students and employees, and addressing grievances and complaints alleging discrimination. The bill would also require the BOG to approve and annually update the nondiscrimination policy recommended by the managing entity, require the governing boards of community college districts (CCDs) to adopt the policy, and impose a fine on CCDs that do not adopt the policy. The bill would further require CCDs to designate a staff person as a Title IX coordinator tasked with specified duties, including responding to complaints alleging discrimination and maintaining a record system of files on those complaints. The bill would establish, for a complainant or respondent dissatisfied with an administrative decision made by the managing entity or the Title IX coordinator regarding the outcome of the complaint, a process to appeal that decision to the Chancellor's Office.

Title: Student Safety: Human Trafficking

Status: Assembly Higher Education Committee

Summary:

This bill would require public and private postsecondary institutions, including California Community Colleges, to update and implement student safety policies and reporting procedures to explicitly include human trafficking. The bill would mandate annual employee training on identifying and reporting human trafficking, expand campus crime records and law enforcement agreements to cover trafficking, and require policies and prompt reporting to law enforcement as conditions for state financial aid participation.

Title: Postsecondary Education: Sexual Harassment, Harassment, Intimidation, and Bullying Policies: Student Orientation and Training

Status: Assembly Higher Education Committee

Summary:

This bill would require colleges and universities to update sexual harassment policies to address technology-facilitated sexual exploitation, including the nonconsensual distribution of digitally created sexually explicit material. The bill also requires campuses to provide harassment and bullying prevention information during student orientation and, if funded, establishes small grants for students harmed by digitally explicit material to help remove the content online.

Title: Public Postsecondary Education: Equity in Higher Education Act: Campus Contact

Summary:

This bill would amend the Equity in Higher Education Act to require California public postsecondary institutions to provide clearer contact information for reporting discrimination or harassment complaints. Specifically, the bill requires campuses to identify and publicly post contact information for the campus office or official responsible for handling complaints under the Equity in Higher Education Act, helping students and employees know where to report violations.

Title: Career Apprenticeship Bridge Program

Status: Senate Rules Committee

Summary:

This bill would create the Career Apprenticeship Bridge Program, administered by the Division of Apprenticeship Standards (Division), to coordinate apprenticeships for in- and out-of-school youth ages 16 to 24 and develop a streamlined youth apprenticeship data system. The bill would require the Division to work with the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office and the California Department of Education to establish program guidelines.

Title: Strong Workforce Program: Work-Based Learning Opportunities: Regional Consortia

Summary:

This bill would expand how funds from the California Community Colleges Strong Workforce Program can be used to support paid work-based learning opportunities. Existing law allows community college districts to use their allocated Strong Workforce funds to provide direct support to students or employers for paid work-based learning. This bill would additionally allow regional career technical education consortia that receive Strong Workforce funding to use their funds in the same way—providing direct support to students, employers, or both to increase employability and employment. The bill also makes conforming changes to state law governing the program.

This bill would establish the Artificial Intelligence Education and Workforce Development Act, aimed at expanding artificial intelligence (AI) education and workforce training in California—especially through community colleges. It would require the California Community Colleges (if funded) to develop statewide guidance on AI use, support AI literacy and skills training for students and instructors, and create pilot programs to integrate AI into classrooms. The bill also promotes partnerships and workforce programs to prepare workers for AI-related jobs, including hands-on training in areas like data centers and infrastructure, and directs the state’s small business office to provide AI-related educational resources.

[AB 1171 \(Patel\)](#)**Amended Date:** 01/15/2026**Title:** Part-Time Community College Faculty Health Insurance Program**Status:** Senate Rules Committee**Position:** Oppose**Summary:**

This bill would revise and recast the Part-Time Community College Faculty Health Insurance Program by expanding eligibility to include part-time faculty who individually purchase health insurance, in addition to multidistrict part-time faculty. It would require community college districts to reimburse participating part-time faculty for their proportionate share of premium costs, as specified, while continuing the program’s existing structure under which the Chancellor apportions up to one-half of eligible premium costs to participating districts.

This bill would prohibit a public employer from questioning a public employee, a representative of a recognized employee organization, or an exclusive representative regarding communications made in confidence between an employee and an employee representative in connection with representation relating to any matter within the scope of the recognized employee organization’s representation. The bill would also prohibit a public employer from compelling a public employee, a representative of a recognized employee organization, or an exclusive representative to disclose those confidential communications to a third party. The bill would not apply to a criminal investigation or when a public safety officer is under investigation and certain circumstances exist.

[AB 1582 \(Ortega\)](#)

Title: Higher Education Employer-Employee Relations Act: Collective Bargaining: Unfair Labor Practices

Summary:

This bill would make it an unfair labor practice for a higher education employer to circumvent or ignore an arbitrator's decision in disputes over contracting out bargaining unit work, including by renewing, extending, or entering into similar contracts that violate terms already interpreted by an arbitrator. The bill would prohibit the Public Employment Relations Board (PERB) from deferring repeat violations to further arbitration and authorize PERB to impose civil penalties of \$1,000 per day for repeat offenses. The bill would also require that remedies include the charging party's attorney's fees and costs.

Title: School and Community College Employees: Absences Due to Illness or Accident

This bill would require community college and TK-12 employees who exhaust their sick leave and remain absent due to illness or injury to receive their full salary for the following five months, instead of the current partial-pay structure, and would make related conforming changes.

Title: Workplace Surveillance Tools

This bill would prohibit an employer from using certain types of workplace surveillance tools, or using workplace surveillance tools to violate or prevent compliance with laws, or infer information about a worker's legally protected status.

Title: Workplace Artificial Intelligence Tools

Status: Assembly Judiciary Committee

Summary:

This bill would require employers to notify workers when artificial intelligence (AI) tools are used to make employment decisions or monitor them, including explaining how those tools may affect their jobs. Employers would also have to keep and annually share a list of all such AI tools in use, and violations could be enforced by the state or through worker lawsuits, with penalties of up to \$500 per violation.

Title: Civil Actions: Protective Orders: Workplace Violence

Status: Assembly Labor and Employment Committee

Summary:

Beginning on July 1, 2027, this bill would authorize an employer to seek a workplace violence restraining order on behalf of a reasonably identifiable group of employees if a credible threat of violence is generally directed at the employer's workplace or at a group of the employer's employees. The bill would not require an employer to name any individual employee as a protected party if the employer seeks a workplace violence restraining order on behalf of a group of employees. This bill would require the Judicial Council to update its forms.

Title: Community Colleges: Deported or Detained Faculty

Status: Assembly Higher Education Committee

Summary:

This bill would require a community college district (CCD) to allow its faculty who departed the United States on or after January 1, 2027, for a specified reason, including, due to immigration enforcement actions by the Department of Homeland Security, and who was teaching for the CCD at the time of departure to perform their instruction and professional duties through distance education or other remote modalities offered by the CCD.

Title: Workers' Compensation: Medical Treatment

Status: Assembly Insurance Committee

Summary:

This bill would change California's Workers' Compensation rules by requiring injured employees, when possible, to schedule medical treatment outside of work hours and to notify their employer if treatment must occur during work. Employers would be required to allow time off for that treatment unless there is a legitimate business reason to reschedule it, and the leave could count toward existing protections like Family and Medical Leave Act/California Family Rights Act. The bill also creates penalties—making it a misdemeanor—for employers who improperly deny leave or retaliate against workers for seeking or taking time off for medical treatment related to a workplace injury.

Title: School Districts: Community College Districts: Short-Term Employees: Classified Service

This bill would establish a rebuttable presumption that a school district or community college district is required to place a short-term employee into the classified service if the short-term employee either performs required service or any other service, or any combination of services, beyond 75% of a school year, or voluntarily separates or is laid off or terminated from employment as a short-term employee before a date constituting 75% of a school year and is then rehired by the school district or community college district at any point, including subsequent school years.

This bill would prohibit an academic or classified employee of a segment of public postsecondary education and a certificated or classified employee of a local educational agency (LEA) or from being dismissed, suspended, disciplined, reassigned, transferred, or otherwise retaliated against (A) for refusing to use, refusing to deploy, or refusing to direct students to, any form of educational technology, or (B) based on any information on that employee that is transmitted, acquired, collected, or produced via artificial intelligence or automated decision system output. The bill would prohibit a segment of public postsecondary education and an LEA from deploying educational technology in the workplace unless (A) it enables employees to quickly and easily turn off, pause, or otherwise refuse to use the educational technology, and (B) the local educational agency, segment of public postsecondary education, or the employee, is not charged anything of value for turning off, pausing, or otherwise refusing to use the educational technology. The bill would request the University of California to comply with these provisions.

This bill would broaden the types of offenses that qualify as egregious misconduct—adding crimes such as human trafficking, child abandonment or neglect, child abduction, and inappropriate contact or communication with a minor. It also prohibits a certificated employee who is dismissed for egregious misconduct from being hired in any education-related position by state agencies, public universities, local agencies, or school districts. The bill would impose additional reporting and employment restrictions to prevent individuals dismissed for serious misconduct from working in education again.

This bill would require the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office to develop and provide informational materials for part-time faculty about their retirement options, including the State Teachers' Retirement System Defined Benefit Program, the Cash Balance Benefit Program, and Social Security. The materials must explain how each option works, the differences in contributions and benefits, and eligibility requirements, so that part-time and substitute faculty better understand their retirement choices and can make informed decisions about membership in available retirement plans.

This bill would require the California Public Employees' Retirement System Board to publicly post key details about an upcoming audit and provide formal written notice to affected employers before the audit begins. Employers must then notify any impacted employee representatives (such as unions) and share information about employees affected by the audit. The bill also establishes requirements for distributing and certifying the final audit report to ensure all relevant parties are informed.

This bill would expand and modernize how employment and wage data is reported and shared in California to improve verification for public benefits and workforce analysis. Specifically, it would require employers (generally those with ten plus employees) to report more detailed information—such as hours worked, occupation, and wages—and require the Employment Development Department to develop systems to share that data with state agencies. The bill directs the state to use this data to verify eligibility for public benefits like CalFresh and Medi-Cal, support workforce planning, and provide relevant wage data to entities like the California Education Interagency Council. It also requires new data-sharing procedures and system updates (through CalSAWS) to be implemented by around 2027–2028.

Employers could limit this to one designated person per 12-month period, but otherwise the bill ensures workers can use existing bereavement leave protections (up to 5 days) to grieve individuals they consider family, not just those related by blood or legal ties.

The bill would request the office of the President of the University of California to join and appoint representatives to the working group. The bill would require the working group to use assessments of unmet demand developed by the respective segments in order to further analyze systemwide, regional, and campus-specific student housing needs. The bill would require the working group to develop a statewide plan that identifies opportunities for intersegmental collaboration to build campus housing and informs future state funding considerations.

The bill aims to improve housing stability and access to higher education for foster youth and homeless students.

Beginning July 1, 2026, colleges would be prohibited from offering or promoting these grants to students unless they receive approval from a designated state entity. To obtain approval, institutions must demonstrate that their programs meet federal eligibility requirements and additional quality and workforce alignment standards, and they must also be approved by the U.S. Department of Education. The bill creates a vetting process, including certification requirements and consultation with an advisory body, to ensure that funded programs lead to meaningful employment outcomes. Overall, the measure adds a layer of state review intended to ensure program quality and accountability, but it may also limit or delay access to these federal funds for some institutions and students.

The bill also limits task order and job order contracts to no more than five years while preserving the validity of individual orders after a contract expires and extends obligations such as sworn contractor disclosures and skilled workforce commitments.

The bill would authorize a non-home community college district, or an eligible institution associated with the non-home community college district, to enter into an instructional services agreement with a county probation department if the home community college district and associated eligible institutions are unable, unwilling, or fail to provide requested academic or career technical education courses to a juvenile justice facility within 90 days of a written request from the administrator of the juvenile justice facility. The bill would prohibit the home community college district and associated eligible institutions from prohibiting, blocking, or otherwise interfering with the ability of the non-home community college district, or an eligible institution associated with the non-home community college district, to provide instruction at the juvenile justice facility.

This bill would require the governing bodies of California's public higher-education systems to post certain information about their members on their official websites. The bill would raise those limits to between \$600 and \$4,500 per month, with different caps based on district size—while keeping existing rules that payment is tied to meeting attendance and may be prorated if meetings are missed.

Districts using the exclusion must certify their eligibility to the Chancellor’s Office annually, and the measure includes safeguards to ensure it does not reduce instructional spending, faculty positions, or instructional quality. The authority would expire by July 1, 2031, or sooner if the federal funding is restored, and the bill would take effect immediately as an urgency statute.

This bill would place a cap on community college district (CCD) unrestricted General Fund reserves beginning in fiscal year 2027-28.

Specifically, the bill would prohibit a CCD from maintaining an annual unrestricted General Fund ending balance that exceeds 50% of that year's unrestricted General Fund expenditures, unless the district satisfies all three of the following conditions:

1. Participation in the Part-Time Community College Faculty Health Insurance Program;
2. Participation in the Part-Time Faculty Office Hours Program; and
3. At least 75% of credit instruction hours are taught by full-time faculty.

If a district exceeds the 50% cap and does not meet all three conditions, the amount above the cap would be required to be proportionally distributed to nonsupervisory and nonmanagement employees based on hours worked in the prior fiscal year, as determined through collective bargaining. The bill also includes language intended to prevent districts from circumventing the cap by transferring funds to other accounts if those transfers would cause the receiving fund to exceed 33% of unrestricted General Fund expenditures.

This bill would require colleges to adopt a written policy to allow a student to take a voluntary medical leave of absence for a period to be determined by the postsecondary educational institution, or for a period of one academic year, whichever is longer, and reasonably accommodate a student facing medical challenges so the student is able complete their courses of study and research. The bill would prohibit the leave of absence policy from, among other things, requiring a student who takes a leave of absence to withdraw from the postsecondary educational institution. The bill would require a postsecondary educational institution to make the leave of absence policy available to faculty, staff, and employees in a required training and available to students at an orientation session.

Title: Student Health: Athletic Coaches: Mental Health Training

This bill would require the Surgeon General to identify and compile a list of approved mental health training programs for athletic coaches by July 1, 2027. Community college districts, TK-12 schools, California State University campuses, and state-funded private and independent postsecondary institutions would be required to have athletic coaches complete this approved student mental health training, with the University of California also requested to do so.

Title: Public Health: Public Postsecondary Education: Student Health Centers: Abortion by Medication Techniques

This bill would require a community college that has a student health center to, upon appropriation by the Legislature, on and after January 1, 2028, offer medication abortion services, promote awareness of those services, provide information on those services to students, and post the availability of those services on its internet website. The bill would also require a student health center on a California State University or University of California campus, on or before January 1, 2028, to promote awareness of the services for abortion by medication techniques that the student health center offers, provide information on those services to students, and post the availability of those services on its internet website.

This bill would eliminate the current case-by-case approval process for college programs to qualify students for a CalFresh eligibility exemption and instead require the state to broadly recognize most public higher education programs—including adult education, career technical education, certificates, and all degree programs, as well as certain state-funded support programs—as meeting the employability requirement, consistent with federal law. It would also require the state to issue updated guidance confirming this change, making it easier for students to qualify for CalFresh without additional program approvals.

This bill would prohibit the California Community Colleges, California State University, or the University of California from disqualifying a student from being hired for an employment position due to the student's failure to provide proof of federal work authorization, except where that proof is required by federal law or where that proof is required as a condition of a grant that funds the particular employment position for which the student has applied. The bill would require the institutions to implement this requirement by January 6, 2027.

This bill would require the California Community Colleges (CCC) and the California State University (CSU), and request the University of California (UC), to develop and implement transfer and articulation agreements to support students transferring from California tribal colleges, including early outreach efforts. It would also require the CSU and CCC, and request the UC, to assess tools, systems, and curricula to facilitate transfer for these students.

Title: Community Colleges: CalWorks Recipients Education Program: Services

This bill would expand services under the CalWORKs Recipients Education Program at California Community Colleges to include direct aid for basic needs and coordinate services to help participants achieve economic mobility, rather than just long-term self-sufficiency. The bill would also allow programs to waive the requirement that employers pay at least 25% of wages for work study positions if the number of on-campus and off-campus work study positions will not decrease.

Title: Community Colleges: Exemption from Nonresident Tuition Fee: College of the Siskiyous

This bill would authorize a community college district to exempt up to 200 students per academic year who reside in specified Oregon counties (Jackson, Josephine, and Klamath) from paying nonresident tuition at the College of the Siskiyous. It would require the Siskiyou Joint Community College District to adopt rules for residency classification and appeals.

This bill would clarify that students who earn a certificate as part of a course sequence toward an associate degree remain eligible for a California College Promise fee waiver.

Title: Public Postsecondary Education: Nonresident Tuition Fee Exemption: Educational Asylum Program

Summary:

This bill would allow California public colleges and universities to create an “educational asylum” program for transfer students from states where laws restrict the teaching of topics such as diversity, equity, inclusion, or critical race theory. Beginning in the 2027-28 academic year, qualifying students admitted to participating institutions could receive an exemption from nonresident tuition and pay in-state tuition instead. The California Department of Education would maintain a list of states with such restrictions, and institutions could set participation limits based on available resources.

Title: Public Postsecondary Education: Tuition and Fees: Team USA Student Athletes

This bill would extend an existing California policy that allows certain Team USA student-athletes training in the state in elite programs approved by the U.S. Olympic and Paralympic Committee to qualify for in-state tuition at public colleges and universities. Current law grants these athletes resident tuition classification but is scheduled to expire on July 1, 2032. The bill removes that sunset date, effectively making the policy permanent so eligible athletes can continue to receive resident tuition rates while training in California. It also provides that if the change creates reimbursable costs for community college districts, the state must reimburse those costs through the normal state-mandate process.

Title: Postsecondary Education: Nonresident Tuition: Exemption: Federal GI Bill

This bill would expand an existing tuition benefit for veterans and certain military-affiliated students at community colleges and the California State University campuses. Specifically, it would add the Montgomery GI Bill–Selected Reserve program to the list of federal programs that qualify students for an exemption from paying nonresident tuition, meaning more eligible students could pay in-state rates if they live in California.
